





#### **DMX mode:**

Operating in a DMX control mode environment gives the user the greatest flexibility when it comes to customising or creating a show. In this mode you will be able to control each individual trait of the fixture and each fixture independently.

To access the DMX mode, press the "MENU" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to show  $\mathbb{R}ddr$  on the LED display. Now press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to choose one of the 2/3/3/4 or 10 DMX channel modes.

Press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to set the required DMX address. Press the "ENTER" button to confirm the setting.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

#### Static colour mode:

To access the static colour mode press "MENU" until  $5 \pm 7 \pm 8$  shows on the LED display. Now press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to select the colour required between  $5 \ 0 \ 1 \sim 5 \ 17$ . Press the "ENTER" button to confirm.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the " $\mbox{\bf MENU}$  button.

## **Operating instructions**



#### Colour mix mode:

In this mode you can set the fixture to any colour and any brightness.

To access the colour mix mode press "MENU" until the display shows Pr - - on the LED display.

Press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to select  $P \cap \square \square$ .

Press the "ENTER" button to show r - - - with 3 digits after on the LED display.

Press the "ENTER" button to confirm.

The  $\Gamma$  represents red,  $\Gamma = \text{green}$ ,  $\Gamma = \text{blue}$  and  $\Gamma = \text{white}$ .

The 3 digits after are the brightness setting from  $\Omega\Omega\Omega\sim 255$ .

#### For example:

If you set r,  $\Gamma$ ,  $\Gamma$  and  $\Gamma$  all to zero, your unit will have no LEDs lit up (blackout).

If you set  $\neg \Box \Box \Box \Box$  to  $\neg \Box \Box \Box \Box$  and  $\Box \Box \Box \Box \Box$  to zero, your unit will show only red LEDs.

Press the "ENTER" button to confirm the setting and move to the next colour.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

#### **Built-in program mode:**

To access built-in program mode press "MENU" until the display shows  $P_{\Gamma}$  - - on the LED display.

Press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to select between  $P \cap \square I \sim P \cap \square I$ .

Press the "ENTER" button to confirm.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

#### Built-in program speed setting:

To access built-in program speed setting press "MENU" until the display shows 5PEE on the LED display. Press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to select between 5P = 1 (slow)  $\sim 5P = 9$  (fast).

Press the "ENTER" button to confirm.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

#### **Sound mode:**

To access sound mode press "MENU" until the display shows 5 aun on the LED display.

Press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to select between  $5 \circ 0 \cdot 1 \sim 5 \circ 0 \cdot 5$ .

Press the "ENTER" button to confirm.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

#### **Sound sensitivity setting:**

To access sound sensitivity setting press "MENU" until the display shows  $5E\pi5$  on the LED display. Press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to select between 5E (low) ~ 5E 9 (high).

Press the "ENTER" button to confirm.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

#### **Master dimmer setting:**

To access master dimmer setting press "MENU" until the display shows  $dI \Pi\Pi$  on the LED display. Press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to select between dI = I (low brightness)  $\sim dI = I$  (high brightness). Press the "ENTER" button to confirm. To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

#### DMX fail setting:

To access DMX fail setting press "MENU" until the display shows FRIL on the LED display. Press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to select between  $\Box \Box$  (when no DMX signal unit goes into last used program or sound mode)  $\sim$   $\Box FF$  (when no DMX signal unit goes into blackout).

Press the "ENTER" button to confirm.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

#### Master/slave mode:

The default setting for this fixture is Master. Set the master unit in one of the built-in programs, sound modes, colour mix mode or static colour mode.

To set the slave unit, press the "MENU" button on the front of the master unit to show  $5 L R_{\perp}$  on the LED display. The unit is now in Slave mode.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.

Please ensure that all slave units are set to the same DMX channel mode as the master unit.

#### IR remote setting:

To access IR remote setting press "MENU" until the display shows  $I \cap F \cap O$  on the LED display. Press the "ENTER" button and use the "UP" and "DOWN" buttons to select between  $\square \cap O$  (IR receiver on)  $\square \cap O$  (IR receiver off).

Press the "ENTER" button to confirm.

To exit out of any of the above options, press the "MENU" button.



#### IR remote functions:

- 01 Sets the unit into blackout off/on (LED on/off)
- 02 Activates the built-in programs, use the '+' and '-' buttons to select the auto mode. Pressing the 'Speed' button followed by the '+' and '-' buttons will then allow the auto mode speed to be adjusted
- 03 Activates the sound modes, use the '+' and '-' buttons to select the sound mode. Pressing the 'Sensitivity' button followed by the '+' and '-' buttons will then allow the sound sensitivity be adjusted
- 04 Activates the strobe, use the '+' and '-' buttons to adjust the strobe speed
- 05 Sets the auto mode speed. Press this button followed by the '+' and '-' buttons to adjust the program speed
- 06 Sets the sound mode sensitivity. Press this button followed by the '+' and '-' buttons to adjust the sound sensitivity
- 07 Activates the DMX mode
  Please note: the DMX address and channel must
  be preset in the menu
- 08 Activates the static colour/manual modes, use the '+' and '-' buttons to select a colour from the preprogrammed static colours or use the 'R', 'G', 'B' or 'W' buttons to create a manual colour. Pressing the 'Fade/unit' button allows the chosen colour to enter the fade program
- 09 Activates a fade in/out on the manual colour selection
- 10 Manual colour selection



- 11 Adjusts the auto mode, sound mode, speed, sound sensitivity, strobe speed and static colour/manual colour modes
- 12 Sets the brightness of auto, sound, static colour and manual modes (1 low brightness, 9 high brightness)





#### Setting the DMX address:

The DMX mode enables the use of a universal DMX controller. Each fixture requires a "start address" from 1-512. A fixture requiring one or more channels for control begins to read the data on the channel indicated by the start address. For example, a fixture that occupies or uses 7 channels of DMX and was addressed to start on DMX channel 100, would read data from channels: 100, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105 and 106. Choose a start address so that the channels used do not overlap. E.g. the next unit in the chain starts at 107.

#### DMX 512:

DMX (Digital Multiplex) is a universal protocol used as a form of communication between intelligent fixtures and controllers. A DMX controller sends DMX data instructions form the controller to the fixture. DMX data is sent as serial data that travels from fixture to fixture via the DATA "IN" and DATA "OUT" XLR terminals located on all DMX fixtures (most controllers only have a data "out" terminal).

#### **DMX linking:**

DMX is a language allowing all makes and models of different manufactures to be linked together and operate from a single controller, as long as all fixtures and the controller are DMX compliant. To ensure proper DMX data transmission, when using several DMX fixtures try to use the shortest cable path possible. The order in which fixtures are connected in a DMX line does not influence the DMX addressing. For example; a fixture assigned to a DMX address of 1 may be placed anywhere in a DMX line, at the beginning, at the end, or anywhere in the middle. When a fixture is assigned a DMX address of 1, the DMX controller knows to send DATA assigned to address 1 to that unit, no matter where it is located in the DMX chain.

#### DATA cable (DMX cable) requirements (for DMX operation):

This fixture can be controlled via DMX-512 protocol. The DMX address is set on the back of the unit. Your unit requires either a standard 3-pin or 5-pin XLR connector for data input/output, see images below.





Further DMX cables can be purchased from all good sound and lighting suppliers or Prolight Concepts dealers.

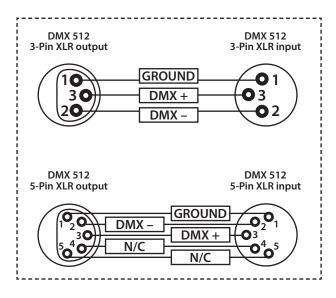
Also remember that DMX cable must be daisy chained and cannot be split.

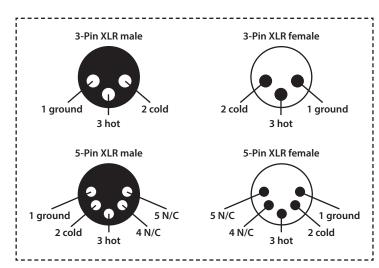


#### Notice:

Be sure to follow the diagrams below when making your own cables. Do not connect the cables shield conductor to the ground lug or allow the shield conductor to come in contact with the XLRs outer casing. Grounding the shield could cause a short circuit and erratic behaviour.




#### **Line termination:**

When longer runs of cable are used, you may need to use a terminator on the last unit to avoid erratic behaviour.

Using a cable terminator will decrease the possibilities of erratic behaviour.

(3-pin - Order ref: CABL90, 5-pin - Order ref: CABL89)



#### 5-pin XLR DMX connectors:

Some manufactures use 5-pin XLR connectors for data transmission in place of 3-pin. 5-pin XLR fixtures may be implemented in a 3-pin XLR DMX line. When inserting standard 5-pin XLR connectors in to a 3-pin line a cable adaptor must be used. The diagram below details the correct cable conversion.








#### **Power linking:**

This fixture provides power linking via the power output on the rear allowing multiple units to be connected together. The maximum number of fixtures that can be connected is 24 fixtures @ 240V or 12 fixtures @ 120V (including the first fixture). After the maximum number of fixtures are connected a new power run will need to be started.

Please note: Caution should be used when power linking other fixtures to the MaxiPar Quad as the power consumption of other fixtures will vary. Fixtures fitted with lamps often require 2/3 times more current on startup, these may require their own power source.
